It is my pleasure to write this letter of recommendation on behalf of Ruth Canji. I first met Ms. Canji in September, 2009 when she was appointed to teach my daughter's 3rd grade class at Orrington Elementary School in Evanston, Illinois. She inspired in them a love of reading and literature. On several occasions, I was able to visit the classroom to witness firsthand her enthusiasm and to see how the children loved working with her. I had the opportunity to chaperone a field trip to the Lincoln Park Zoo and was impressed by Ms. Canji's organization and attention to her students during this trip.

Recently, my daughter's regular classroom teacher returned from her leave of absence. While the children were happy to have their teacher return, they were saddened to say good-bye to Ms. Canji. To their delight, they still see Ms. Canji on a daily basis, as she is the permanent building substitute teacher at Orrington Elementary School this year. On several occasions I have seen students run to Ms. Canji for hugs when they see her in the hall or at school events. Such was the extent of her impact on these children.
